

### **Who is Justice Jim Moseley?**

- **AN EXPERIENCED JUSTICE.** Thirteen years' service on the Fifth District Court of Appeals in Dallas. Authored over 1,000 published opinions in all areas of civil and criminal law. Highest-rated appellate justice in Dallas Bar Association's 2009 Judicial Evaluation Poll.
- **A SEASONED ATTORNEY.** Fourteen years' private practice in Dallas and Odessa. Served as Regional Director of the Federal Trade Commission during the Reagan administration. Former Chair of the State Bar Antitrust & Business Litigation Section. Elected member, American Law Institute.
- **A PROVEN CONSERVATIVE.** Founding member of the Dallas Lawyers' Chapter of the Federalist Society. Appointed to court of appeals in 1996 by Governor Bush. Active in Republican Party since 1980. Former Precinct Chair, County Vice-Chair, County Chair, and S.R.E.C member. Dallas County Chair for Victory '94 GOP campaign.
- **A COMMON-SENSE TEXAN.** Born and raised in Eastland County (near Abilene). Attended public schools, Tarleton State, and Cisco Jr. College. Earned undergraduate and law degrees from Baylor. ### **Justice Jim Moseley on our judicial system.**

“We need judges who decide cases based on what the law is, not what they think it should be—judges who understand the differences between the roles of the legislature, the executive, and the judiciary.”

“Texans want judges who will focus their time and attention on the work of the court. Every success I've enjoyed came as the result of hard work. I will continue that work ethic on the Texas Supreme Court.”

“Texans elect judges on a partisan basis, but a judge's proper role after taking the bench must be non-partisan. There is no such thing as Democratic or Republican justice. My history of support from all segments of the bar is proof I will apply the law fairly and without bias.”

“No system of judicial selection is perfect. Time and again Texans have confirmed they want the right to elect their judges, demonstrating their desire to restrict the power of state government over their lives. I recognize people of good faith can and do disagree on this issue. However, I will continue to focus my efforts on improving the system we have.”

“Even before my service at the FTC, I understood that competition brings the best to consumers—in the economic marketplace, the public square, and the political arena. I believe my party and my state benefit from having a choice for Texas Supreme Court. During the coming months, I will explain to voters why they should choose me to serve them on the Texas Supreme Court.”
