**James C. Miller Endorses Moseley for Texas Supreme Court**  
Reagan Budget Director, FTC Chairman, Supports Former Appointee

Dallas – James C. Miller III, former Director of the Office of Management and Budget and Chairman of the Federal Trade Commission during the Reagan Administration, announced his support for Justice Jim Moseley’s candidacy for the Texas Supreme Court. Under Miller’s leadership at the FTC, Moseley served as Regional Director of the Commission’s Dallas office.

"After President Reagan named me as FTC Chairman, I worked to assemble the strongest leadership team possible. Naming Jim Moseley to head the Dallas office was one of my better decisions. He’s a strong lawyer, a strong conservative, and a strong manager. He was instrumental in carrying out the Commission’s pro-competition, pro-marketplace approach to consumer protection."

"I’ve followed Jim’s career after he left the FTC," continued Miller. "As a Justice on the Dallas Court of Appeals, he understands the proper role of the judiciary is to interpret the laws—not make them. He’s applied the law fairly, with intellectual honesty, and without bias. I’m certain he’ll bring those qualities to the Texas Supreme Court, and I endorse him without reservation."

In response, Justice Moseley stated, "I’m thankful to Jim Miller for the opportunity to serve at the FTC during the Reagan Administration. My four years as Regional Director were incredibly rewarding. I learned firsthand how society benefits when the law is clearly stated and consistently applied. That knowledge still helps me today as a judge. I was proud to be a part of Jim’s team at the FTC, and I’m proud to have him on my team as I run for Supreme Court."

As FTC Regional Director, Moseley was responsible for enforcing federal antitrust and consumer protection laws in Texas and the four surrounding states.

Miller served as Chairman of the FTC from 1981 to 1985, when President Reagan named him as Director of the Office of Management and Budget. He served as OMB Director until 1988. He has also served as Chairman of the Board of Governors of the U.S. Postal Service, and he continues to serve as a member of that board. Additionally, Miller is a member of the board of directors of four mutual funds, Clean Energy Fuels Corp., and Americans for Prosperity. Miller is a Senior Fellow (by courtesy) at the Hoover Institution (Stanford University), and a Distinguished Fellow at the Center for Study of Public Choice and the Mercatus Center, both at George Mason University.

The endorsement of Jim Miller follows the endorsement of former Texas Supreme Court Justice Craig T. Enoch, former State Bar of Texas Presidents Harriet Miers, Lonny Morrison, Guy Harrison and Darrell Jordan. Moseley was previously endorsed by Committeewoman Cathie Adams, Committeeman Bill Crocker and the Texas Restaurant Association, along with many party leaders and grassroots activists from the S.R.E.C. and precincts across Texas.
